### Year 1

Year 1 has had another busy week. The children enjoyed their trip to the Mowlem to watch 'The Three Little Pigs'. In English we have continued exploring our book: 'Whatever Next'. We had an unexpected letter from Owl arrive in the classroom. The children were very excited that the Owl had sneakily come into our class. They have been writing letters back to the Owl. In RE, we have focused on the 'Visitation' story. The children had different pictures that represented the story so that they could re-tell the story. We

had a class quiz about the story and each team did very well and they all scored 10 points!

#### Year 2

As ever, we have been working incredibly hard in Year 2. We started the week with a special visit from Canon John who had kindly brought in some oil of Chrism used in baptisms for us to look at and smell. He explained where the oil comes from, how it is infused to make it smell and how it is blessed – it was a fascinating talk. In RE, we were looking at the Annunciation to Zechariah and then had great fun (while consolidating the story and learning!) creating freeze-frame pictures for this Bible story. In Geography, we have continued looking at features of physical and human geography by studying the physical and human geographical features to be found in Asia.

Year 3 has had another busy and interesting week. Do you know what a Tabernacle is? Or where you might find it in the church? In RE we have been finding out about different things you might find in a church – We are now planning to visit St Edward's Church to see if we can find them inside.
