We have been thinking about all the emotions in the story and when we might feel them. We practiced some different breathing and calming exercises outside and then found some brilliant puddles to splash in. In our PSHE this week, we have been thinking about all the important people in our lives and who we could turn to if we need to share our worries. We made some super high-5 hands with our important people on.

Year 1

Year 1 has had another busy week. In RE this week, we have been practicing the Lord's Prayer and putting actions to the prayer to help us remember the words. The children used Play Doh to create symbols for the prayer. In Science we have been thinking about more animal groups. This week has been a focus on the feature of birds. 
Year 5
