We also have a book advent and have been opening and sharing a new Christmas story every afternoon.
Year 1	Year 1 has had another busy week. They have been working really hard remembering the songs and their lines. The children are very excited to show their family the Nativity. In RE we have been thinking about the birth of Jesus and why God sent us His son Jesus. The children have been getting into the roles of Joseph, Mary, Donkey and a sheep to answer
