News from the classes

Reception

Reception has had a very busy week as always! We have been thinking about the seasons in particular Autumn and Winter. We looked at what animals do to prepare themselves for winter and the cold weather coming in. We learnt all about hibernation and which animals hibernate during the winter, we made some brilliant hibernation dens outside and produced some super bear artwork.



Year 1

Year 1 has had another busy week. The children have started their history topic- focusing on the change of toys from their grandparents to the toys the children play with now. If you have any pictures of toys that you used to play with, please can you bring them in so the children can have a discussion about the similarities and differences. In Maths, we have continued our learning on part whole models and addition up to the number 10. The children

have all worked hard on doing this independently and they have had a go at creating their own number sentences for their friends to complete. In Art, the children have had a go at drawing an animal from observation.

Year 2

Year 2 started the week off with a wonderful workshop run by the <u>Stuff and Nonsense</u> <u>Theatre Company!</u> One of their puppet makers spent the afternoon with us and showed us how to make the most amazing rod pig puppets. We greatly enjoyed this activity and are very proud of the puppets that we made. In English, we have started writing our own firework poems while in Maths we have been comparing numbers. We have looked at the role of a prophet in the Old Testament in RE (focusing particularly on Isaiah and how he shared the news that God would send us a saviour) and then wrote a job advertisement for a prophet. This then led us to create a piece of artwork contrasting light and dark: Jesus is the Light of the World. As you can tell, it was another busy week, but we all love working hard and learning as much as we can!



Year 3

Year 3 has been working super hard this week. We have continued to finish our RE work by learning all about stewards of creation and what their role is. We have also been learning

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	about fairness and the children have been comparing education at St Mary's school and education at a school in Cambodia. The children then came up with some really interesting ideas about what the world would be like if everyone was treated fairly. They came up with suggestions such as; if people
	were treated fairly, it may stop wars and bring peace to the world, crime may be reduced, poverty could disappear and everyone would be equal.
