News from the classes

Reception

Reception have been superstars this week! We have been learning about the Lunar New Year and the celebrations that take place. We have learnt that this year is going to be the year of the snake and have shared the story of 'The Great Race'. We enjoyed making lanterns, dragons and a giant snake!







Year 1	Year 1 have had another busy week. We have started our new book in English, we are
	reading different Paddington Bear books. This links in nicely with the work we have been
	doing in geography. In Maths we have been focusing on the teen numbers, and they have
	worked hard with this. We have started our learning on Grace Darling in History and
	thinking about why she was a heroine. Great work Year 1, keep up the hard work.
Year 2	Year 2 has impressed Mrs Norman and me greatly with the amount of work they have
	completed this week and how focused they have been! We used the historical knowledge
	we had found out about Florence Nightingale's work in Scutari Hospital when completing
	an imaginative English task: we wrote a letter pretending that we were a nurse working
	with Florence Nightingale and referenced all the facts that we had learnt. In RE, we looked
	at different paintings that represented the baptism of Jesus (as if we were in a gallery),
	writing down comments and wondering questions. In Maths, we've started looking at
	column addition (without regrouping). In DT, we worked through a design cycle by
	investigating fixed and rotating axles and then designing our own vehicle in accordance
	with some strict design criteria. We wrote detailed instructions and then greatly enjoyed
	making our vehicles (especially measuring and sawing the wooden dowels)! We will be
	decorating them and testing them next! Well done, Team 2.6! Keep up your amazing
	work!
Year 3	Year 3 have been continuing to read their class text – Poppy Pym and have had a busy
	week. We enjoyed an afternoon of singing with Suzannah learning songs for our concert
	that takes place in March. We are looking forward to her next visit.
Year 4	We've had a good week in year 4. We've carried on our class text Beowulf and have written
	a character description about the main character in the story. In Science we've come to
	the end of our topic on 'Animals Including Humans', rounding things off with a fun
	investigation about the digestive system. In RE we've been learning about the parable of
	the prodigal son and linked it to other famous stories that we are familiar with that teach
	the message of forgiveness. Well done year 4 for another great week.
Year 5	Year 5 has worked hard this week and demonstrated many positive attributes towards
	learning. We had a lovely time going on our birdwatch where we were able to spot some
	robins and blackbirds and a thrush. No goldfinches sadly though, or my favourite, a
	nuthatch.
