Reception

Reception have had a lovely first few days at 'big school'. Lots of time for exploring our new school, playing with the parachute and making new friends. We have been investigating colours and sharing lots of stories together. Next week we are going to be having PE on Tuesday and Wellie Wednesdays the following day, they will need to wear their PE kit on both days.

Year 1
